CALL FOR PANEL PROPOSALS

As the consequence of increased diversity within and between religious groups it is more difficult for societies to manage pluralism and multiculturalism, especially with the decline of the power and membership of what were mainline religious groups. Multiculturalism is usually regarded as fulfilling this role. The principle of multiculturalism is intended to protect religious and cultural diversity, civic-mindedness and human rights. But some groups refuse to recognize the very existence of other groups, based on their own exclusivist doctrinal position or ethnicity. The paradox of multiculturalism is that very doctrinal position has a place in society, including doctrines which deny multiculturalism itself. To tackle this problem, this conference thus also explores the extent to which we can learn from Islamic traditions believed to prioritize public interest (maslahah) that revolves around the issues of protecting the rights for life, reproduction, intellectuality, property and freedom of religion over any other things.
